## JPAC International Exhibition 2016

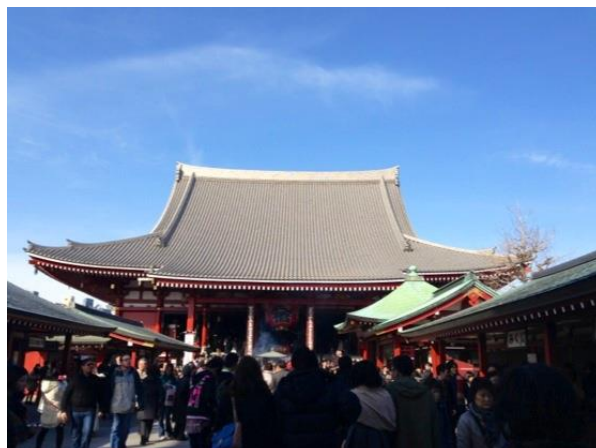
Dear Members,
